

Economic Assets

WATER USE	Surface water or groundwater used for urban water supply/ disposal; industrial water supply; irrigation; rural domestic and stock uses; fishing; eel production; coastal water supporting recreational and commercial fisheries and trade routes.
LAND USE	Uses of land for agriculture; horticulture; forestry; agroforestry; plantations; mining; commerce and tourism.
INFRASTRUCTURE	Roads; railways; bridges; ports; power supplies; water supply; telecommunications lines; residential dwellings; commercial buildings; industrial buildings; urban community buildings; farm improvements including tracks, buildings, fences, drains, and dams.

Environmental Assets

COASTS & MARINE	Coastal land and wetlands; estuaries; in-shore coastal waters; marine waters to three nautical miles; Marine National Parks and Sanctuaries; and the shipping trade.
SURFACE WATERS	Wetlands; lakes; rivers and streams.
GROUNDWATER	Groundwater that supports natural systems such as wetlands or native vegetation.
ATMOSPHERE	Climate and air quality.
VEGETATION	Remnant and riparian vegetation including corridors, roadside and stream bank vegetation; woodlands; grasslands; native forests; native terrestrial and aquatic flora; rare, endangered and vulnerable flora species; ecological communities; habitats including non-native species.
FAUNA	Native terrestrial and aquatic fauna, including invertebrates; rare, endangered and vulnerable species including migratory species.
SOIL	Soil ecosystem functions.

Social Assets

HERITAGE	Indigenous heritage including burial places and other locations of special significance, whether inland or near water. Structures including stone walls; mining relics; buildings of significance; and parts of the landscape with special historical significance.
RECREATION	Sites for sight seeing and tourism; recreational fishing; hunting; camping; bushwalking; orienteering; waterway recreation; vehicular recreation including trail bikes and four-wheel drives; and cycling (mountain and racing).
LANDSCAPE	The vistas valued by the community and visitors.
COMMUNITY	The people and social organisations that comprise a community and their skills; community and individual knowledge; community and individual confidence; community structure; and social cohesion.
